DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

'Banshee Chapter' is a project conceived to bring a fresh new type of thriller tale into the horror genre. Using a gritty documentary hand-held style of cinematography, combined with a spellbinding mystery narrative, this unusual new tale will make viewers both fascinated and terrified. The goal of this film is to immerse the audience in a frightening new 3D reality that grabs the audience with a story that is all too real.

This film follows one woman, Anne Roland, a young online journalist working on a video documentary about her friend from college, James Hirsch, who is now missing. She uncovers a web of secrets when James and his friend disappear after ingesting an undocumented research chemical. The labyrinthine trail of evidence leads her into the disturbing world of black ops chemical projects, unexplained radio transmissions, and shadowy disfigured entities in the blackness of night. Anne will do anything to uncover what lies behind her friend's disappearance. But to her horror, she discovers that it wants to find her too.

The script itself is based on several years researching real-life secret government experiments with strange mind-altering chemicals (see next section: Facts Behind the Film). The adage "truth is stranger than fiction" could not be more true in this case. Some of the most shocking events of the story are based on actual facts, incidents and cases recorded during the decades of government programs. All of these different incidents are pulled into one storyline that aims to spellbind the viewer, giving just enough evidence to hint at a much larger secret waiting. Though the film doesn't answer every possible question, enough is revealed to leave the audience wanting more... potentially in a sequel.

The film uses a documentary style approach, finding seemingly ordinary people thrust into increasingly disturbing events. Shot in 3-D on 4k digital RED cameras, the imagery looks vivid, gritty, immersive, and most importantly: real. This visual choice is important because recent years of box office results have demonstrated an emerging audience coming of age on YouTube videos that craves incredibly realistic thrillers and horror.

Groundbreaking new smash hit horror films like 'The Last Exorcism', 'Blair Witch Project', and the 'Paranormal Activity' franchise have grossed millions by redefining horror with an unmistakably realistic style in which extraordinary events take place. New science fiction thrillers like 'District 9', 'Monsters' and 'Cloverfield' found success by giving the viewer a first-person front row seat into the monster movie genre.

New advanced digital film technologies now allow for filming in the most extraordinary locations, settings, and confined spaces. No longer does low-light meaning shooting under high-wattage studio lights representing the moonlight. Now darkness can be filmed exactly as black and foreboding as it appears in real life. No longer does the cinematography force the viewer to feel removed from the action, as if it was a studio fantasy happening outside of reality, this new breed of cinema has begun to portray exactly what real life looks like. All of these new technologies will be leveraged to create a powerfully realistic three dimensional visual and audio experience while keeping production costs down to a minimum.

This film will introduce a whole new dimension into the genre of gritty realistic thrillers. It's a fast paced blend of fact and fiction into a roller coaster journey of scares, intriguing characters, and a mystery unlike anything audiences have seen before.

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FACTS BEHIND THE FILM

HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS

One of the most disturbing parts of 'Banshee Chapter' is that the events and incidents described within are based on real evidence, researched and uncovered in recent years. The true story behind the government's covert research into mind control and experimental psychotropic chemicals spanned several decades. Although the truth may never be entirely revealed due to destroyed documents, much evidence remains.

What follows are some of the true historical events, incidents, and people that are referenced within the narrative of 'Banshee Chapter'.

MK Ultra

Project MKULTRA, was the code name for a covert CIA mind-control and chemical interrogation research program, run by the Office of Scientific Intelligence. This official U.S. government program began in the early 1950s, continuing at least through the late 1960s, and it secretly and illegally used United States citizens as its test subjects.

The published evidence indicates that Project MKULTRA involved the surreptitious use of many types of experimental new drugs, as well as other methods, to manipulate individual mental states and to alter brain function. The ultimate goal of the project was to uncover the secret of mind control, but the research quickly spiraled out of control into more terrifying areas. The study resulted in several deaths. CIA Director Richard Helms ordered all MKULTRA files destroyed. Pursuant to this order, most CIA documents regarding the project were destroyed, making a full investigation of MKULTRA impossible.



University of New Mexico 1995 DMT Experiment

In a secret FDA study conducted from 1990 through 1995, University of New Mexico psychiatrist Dr. Rick Strassman found that many volunteers injected with significant doses of the chemical dimethyltryptamine (DMT) had disturbing experiences with a perceived supernatural entity. Each of the subjects would give a matching description of the shadow figures they had encountered. The recorded encounters left the patients terrified, often fleeing from the testing location in a state of shrieking panic.

Strassman would later advance the theory that a massive release of DMT from the pineal gland prior to death or near death was the cause of the near death experience phenomenon.


THE MISSING ENGINEER

Philip Taylor Kramer was a bass guitar player for the rock group Iron Butterfly during the 1970s. The band is best known for their acid rock song 'Inna Gadda Da Vida'. After leaving the band he obtained a degree in aerospace engineering, worked on the MX missile guidance system for the US Department of Defense and later on fractal compression, facial recognition systems, and advanced communications.

In 1990 at the age of 38, Kramer co-founded an engineering company to develop data compression techniques for CD-ROMs. Five years later, Kramer and his son believed they had worked out a mathematical breakthrough which allowed them communicate with another dimension.

Kramer had become increasingly paranoid and began telling family members that he believed someone was trying to get him. He disappeared on February 12th, 1995 after driving into LAX to pickup one of his company's investors.

Four years later, on May 29, 1999, Kramer's Ford Aerostar minivan and remains were found by photographers at the bottom of Decker Canyon near Malibu, California. Authorities ruled his death as a probable suicide committed on the day on which he was last seen.



NUMBERS STATIONS

Number Stations are recorded shortwave radio stations of uncertain origin. They generally broadcast artificially generated voices reading streams of numbers, word, letters (sometimes using a spelling alphabet), tunes or Morse Code. They are in a wide variety of languages and the voices are usually female although sometimes male or children's voices are used.

One popular theory among short wave radio operators is that the broadcasts are used to send messages to spies. Others speculate that some of these stations may be related to illegal drug smuggling operations. According to the research notes made for the Conet Project, Numbers Stations have been reported since World War I. If accurate, this would make Numbers Stations among the earliest radio broadcasts.

A three decade collection of actual Numbers Stations broadcasts are available online as part of the Conet Project.

Swedish born actress Katia Winter moved to London at an early age, where she studied acting and film editing. After making a move to the US she immediately booked the lead female role 'Arena' opposite Kellan Lutz ('Twilight') and Samuel L. Jackson. Soon after she starred in the 2012 independent film 'Love Sick Love' alongside Matthew Settle ('Gossip Girl').

In 2012 she appeared in the NCIS episode 'Need To Know' and in the same year she also joined the cast of 'Dexter' for the show's seventh season, playing the recurring role of Nadia, a Ukrainian stripper who works in a Miami club.

They have also just released Victor Quinaz's comedy 'Breakup at a Wedding' through Oscilloscope.

They won a 2012 Independent Spirit Award for Best First Feature for producing J.C Chandor's 'Margin Call'. The film premiered at Sundance, played the Berlinale, and New Directors/New Films, received outstanding reviews, won several other awards, and went on to gross more than \$15 million around the globe.
